Senator Candidate Discussion - Speeches

Chloe Ecklund: I'm an early ed and special ed major; want to get more involved on campus; held several leadership positions on campus; I really want to listen and advocate for students to help solve issues.

Natalie Bowman: I am a secondary education English major; 4 years in student government and in Model UN; I'm looking to reach out and solve issues across the campus community.

Q&A

Bowman – what is your leadership style? – My leadership style is one that is personable and associate very well with people. I have made it a priority to reach out to others and be a very welcoming person to hear new ideas and perspectives.

Ecklund – what is your leadership style? – People-first; I always want to look out for other people and hear their opinions first.

Bowman – could you expand upon your role in student government? – I was not involved in the cabinet, but I ran every year; I was a very vocal member and coordinated as needed with other organizations for events on campus; I offered a lot of help in planning several events.

Ecklund – what was your leadership experience in high school like? – I was an E-Board member of my high school choir and helped arrange finances for different trips; cheer captain in my sophomore year in high school; rotary club newsletter.

(Both) What would you like to do in SGA – (Ecklund) I want to advocate for students because when I had issues and went to my student government, they did not seem to listen. (Bowman)

Ecklund – could you expand upon your priority of safety? – Both as a woman and as a student, I believe that safety should be a top priority on campus and is essential

Bowman – could you expand upon wanting better overall education? – You must meet with the Dean and speak with them. Perhaps speaking with the Dean and listening to students' ideas would help to foster a better relationship, and safer community and improve the overall well-being of students on campus.

Both – **How did you both hear about SRSGA?** – (Bowman) throughout all of campus but found out about the specific position with Senator Gable. (Ecklund) encouraged through Senator Williams.

Both – **What is your passion in life?** – (Ecklund) I have always wanted to help people and teaching is an outlet for that. (Bowman) I'm a humanitarian at heart and always want to help advocate for others. I feel very safe in this community and want to help improve where I can.
