The issue on participation with E-Board -> SGA internal VP and club outside of it, football game with military appreciation it was a heated rash decision for me to quit and I apologized but had to reapply by

Buchan - Heated rash decisions - can you make calculated decisions that benefit the Senate?

I am on the board of directors and this was a pride type thing I can make calculated decisions and have done this before this had to do with the last VP and myself

Stiles – why rejoin after slandering - don't care about SGA and I noticed in the application pointing out DEIB's importance but don't really care about the ideas of teenagers in the senate and makes me worry about the qualities of leadership

Active duty for 12 years worked with every race and background and religion and received an award for DEIB strong miscommunication, have never slandered SGA I love this organization, promised participation and did not receive, Senator Sones was the only one to show up and seemed like SGA did not care about veterans after talking with both advisors and E-Board as well we have realized that the issue lied with last VP so it is figured out.. I am gruff I was in the military it's not that I don't care for feelings, I was told I was being aggressive on a social media app, if you feel like that please come to me, I don't recognize it because that is something that I don't see

Stiles – do you as E-Board feel the issue is resolved?

Hood – occupational therapy off in Harrisville I didn't hear much and didn't know about the situation

Godfrey – aggressive convo on group me was regarding the... E-Board instructed not to speak on it and made a comment saying we will talk more lately, Chris was upset and later apologized, no hard feelings, water under the bridge now

Bloom – a fair share of communication between Chris and myself, a bit of aggressiveness between us, Chris yelled at me in the office, and feel as though it is my duty as president to encourage an inclusive environment for everyone, hesitation on my part on how to move forward, with the title of president there is respect needed. If he can speak to me that way how is he speaking to all of you, has since apologized but I am hesitant

Hale – issues during the last term, on a more positive note how would you like to have a positive influence

Chris – working with SAA on accessibility on the shuttle, something I feel strongly about being a disabled veteran hoping to follow as I graduate, working with all of you, there were some issues but I understand and have come to an understanding talking to leaders and feel that I can still work with all of you

Austin – as a person who comes from a family with a strong military background, I understand how individuals act in the military, but that's not how everyone acts... I don't get to be an abrasive human towards my small children, they are humans like me I don't get to treat them that way... If I had treated someone else like that I wouldn't have a job anymore so I think it is important to understand the difference between rash/unprofessional and straightforward

Snyder – was this related to a previous VP, why didn't this happen attendance at the event happen

Bloom – had meeting prior with myself and Wendy and had event the following Monday and received a resignation letter, Chris met Wendy.

Snodgrass – no one from SGA came to me about the incident, thanked Senator Sones for attending but have not heard anything from anyone else, not monetary

Rezzetano – I do my job and that's about it, in all my time working with Chris he has not spoken badly to me, I apologize because I was not in Slippery Rock, and I think it's sad that I was not able to attend

Warren - I would say that as humans we are prone to our passion, good and bad passions different, we all have moments of I wish we hadn't done that, the fact that he has atoned for it, whether or not we accept this apology, are we as an org. Something that gives second chances

Buchan – After SGA did not attend, was there any attempt at a solution?

Chris – Sunday email sent out, bonding event went great, no mention of SVA bonding event.. That is why I emailed Ella and the old VP and then offered my resignation... The rash part is that I quit without wanting to. I said I would end my time immediately and I felt bad, there was not any engagement afterward,.. Received an email after that was not helpful, but there were issues with that and the rash decision.. I should have allowed dialogue before I put that down Sennett – obviously you're passionate, if you're planning on graduating in Dec. What are your intentions for next two months?

Chris – some of the stuff we did last year, big things being accessibility, being a disabled student I want to make sure campus is as accessible as possible, want to do better

Double – on a positive note, I believe we was an org are the type that will offer second chance, Chris is a very passionate individual and worked tirelessly to better the organization and continues to work tirelessly .. although he can sometimes let passions get the better of him, I have never seen him just try to be mean, he believes there is a justifying reason for it, very proud of his veteran background, was told there would be participation when there wasn't... I trust him and E-Board's word when they say they talked about it and trust that he knows he made a rash decision.. As a whole, Chris has helped out for the better
